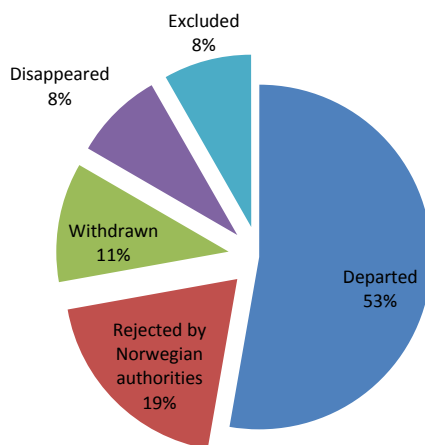

Comments to the statistics:

One individual can apply with VARP more than once. Please note that the numbers refer to number of applications, not number of individuals who have applied.

Please also note that an applicant may submit documentation in the processing period that indicate a different nationality than the one first registered. Similarly UDI may have registered them with a different nationality than the one being revealed in the processing period. This may alter the number per nationality in the various reporting periods.

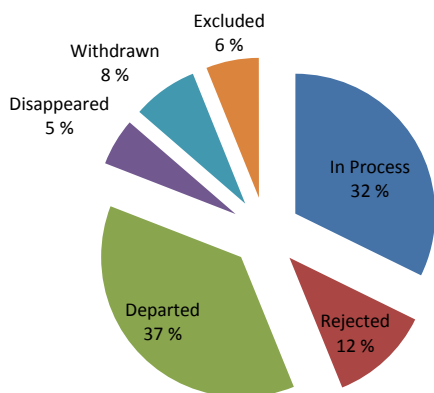
The total processing status is based on the total number of persons applied and NOT accepted.

*This figure is the total figure for 2011. These figures from years prior to 2010 are not available.

** Please note that this figure includes two Counter Trafficking cases returning in April 2011 and four Counter Trafficking cases returning in December 2011.

***Please note that the number of applications in previous months may change due to the backtracking of application dates for those sent per mail; and due to children being born in the application process and eventually are updated with the same application date as their parents once they are registered with a DUF number.

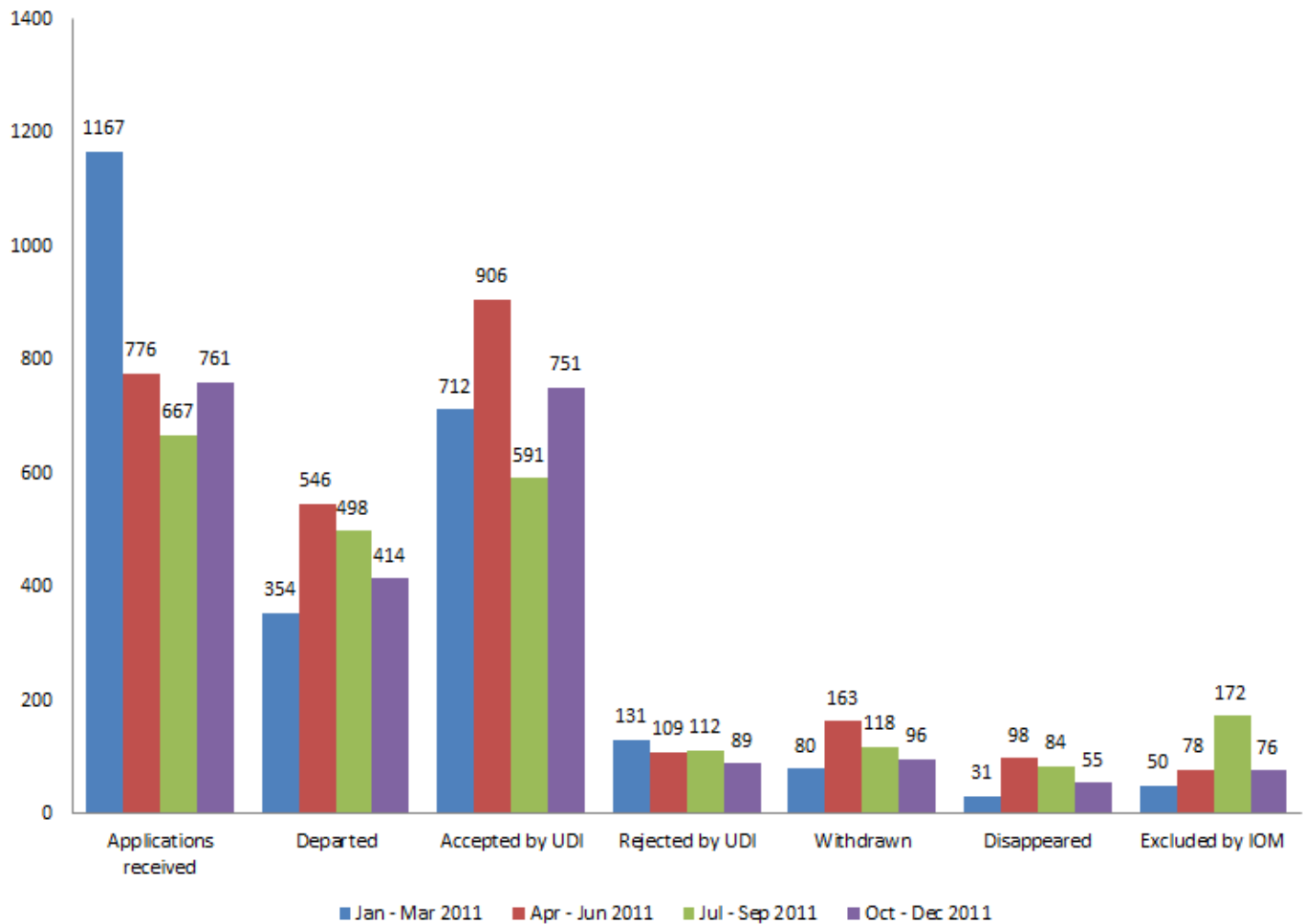
Percentage of VARP applications in 2011*: breakdown of various statuses



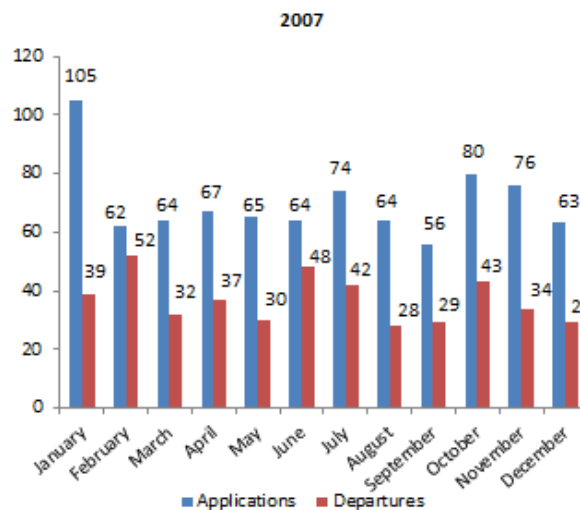
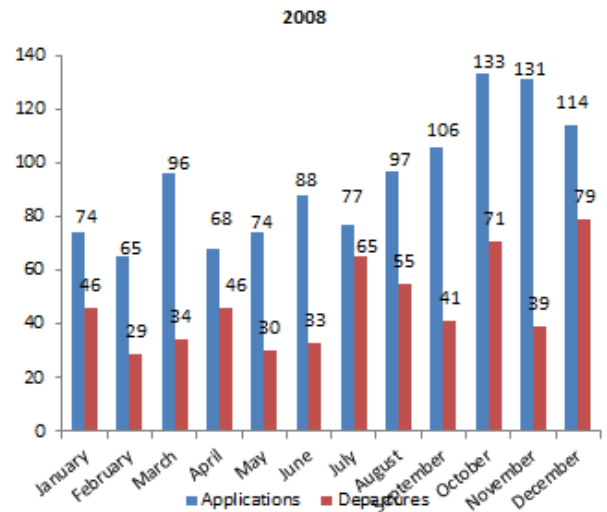
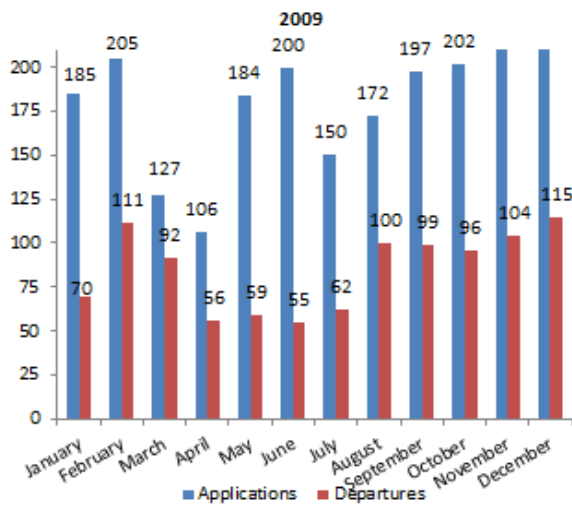
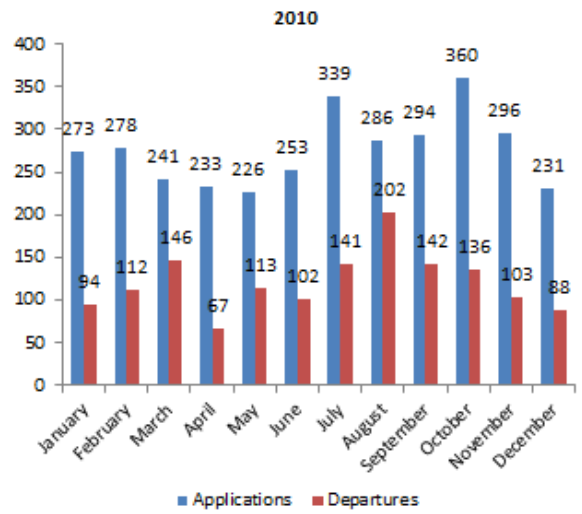
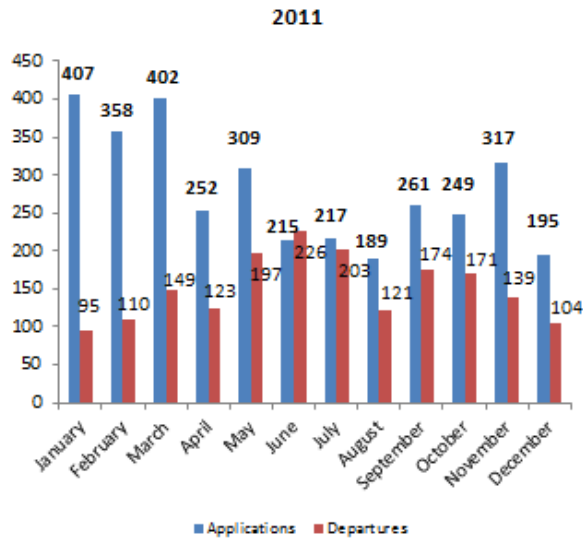
* These figures are calculated based on applications registered in 2011 and their status per 31.12.2011. Contrary to the regular numbers provided in the VARP monthly reports, these figures only indicate what has happened to those individuals who applied in 2011. These numbers will not add up or be similar to those in the VARP monthly report as many cases who applied in 2011 are still in a process with IOM and hence the cases are not closed yet (32% are currently in process), either rejected, departed, excluded, disappeared or withdrawn. The number "in process" is not fixed but clearly indicates cases that are pending as of 31.12.2011.

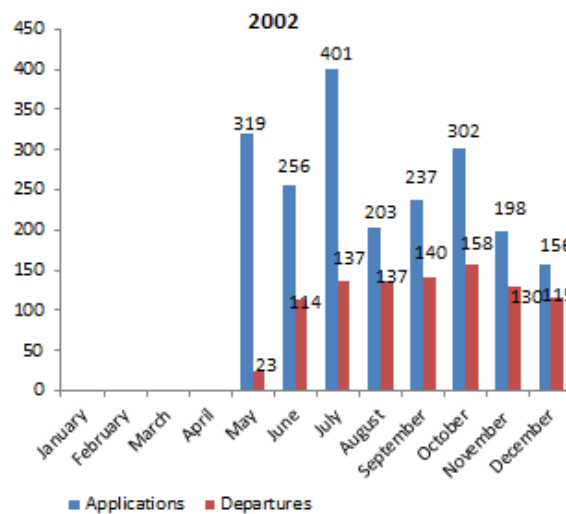

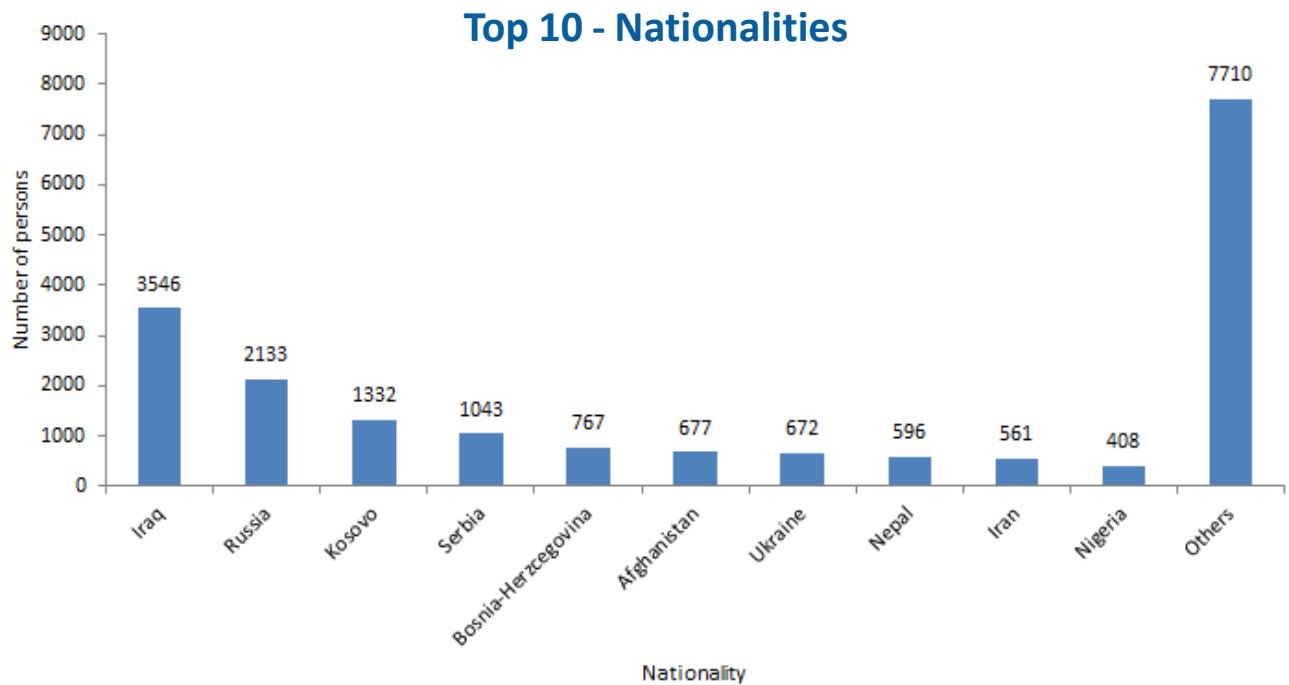

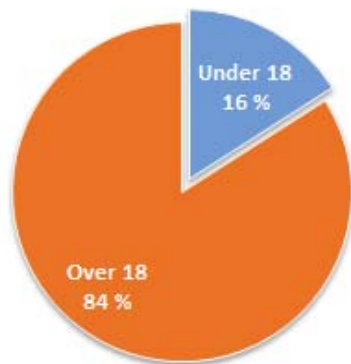

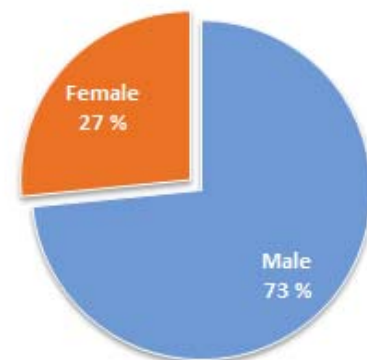
4. Nationality, sex and age breakdown of VARP applicants: May 2002 - December 2011

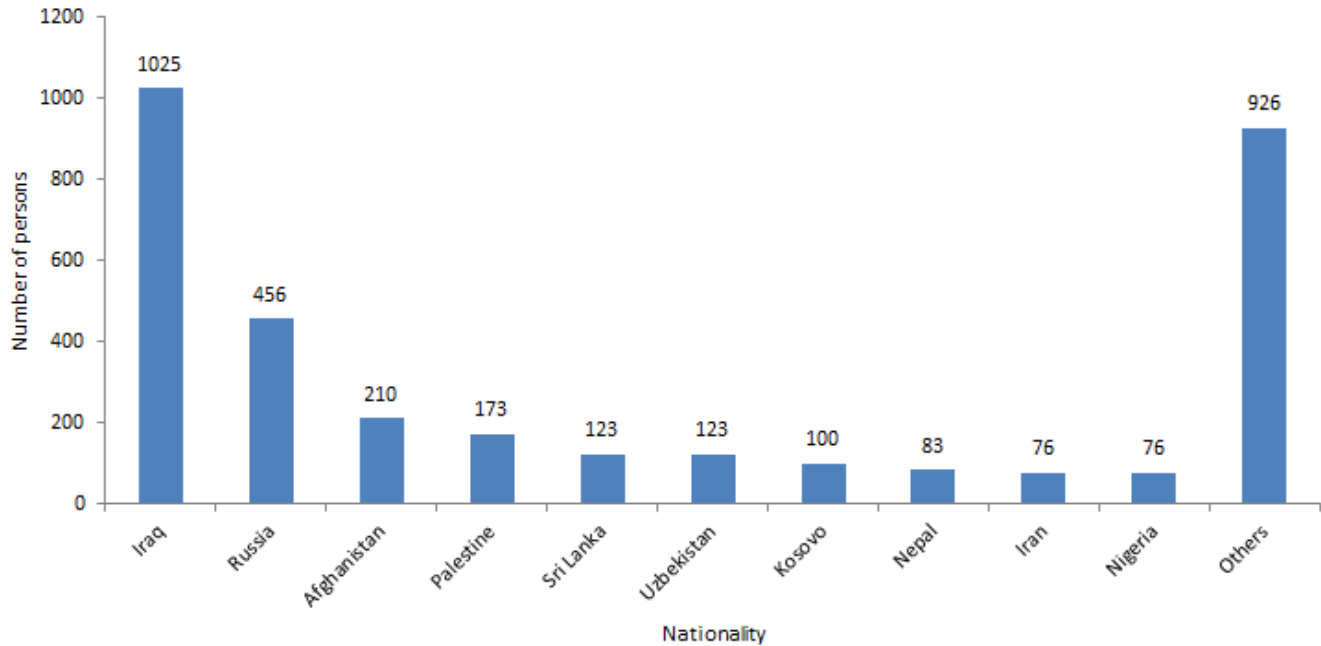

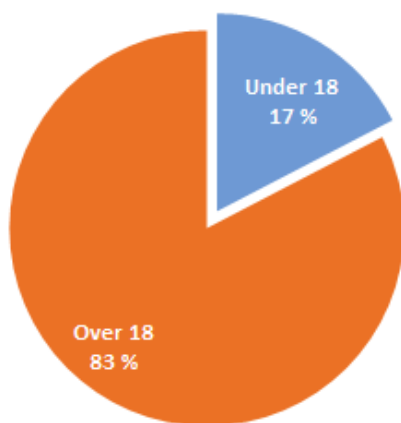


5. Nationality, sex and age breakdown of VARP applicants: January 2011 - December 2011

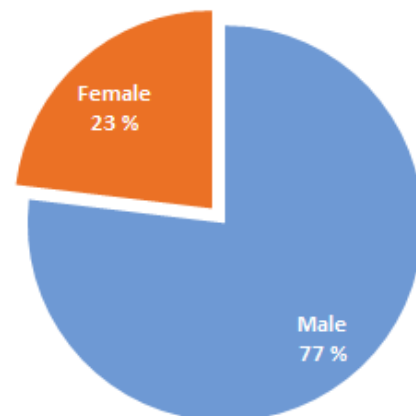

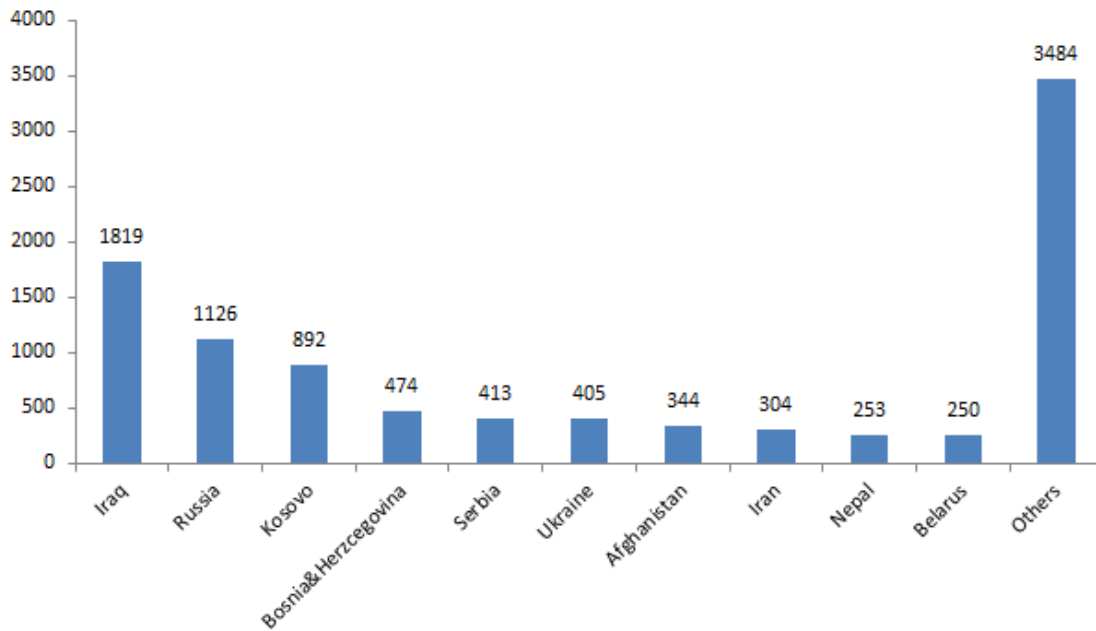

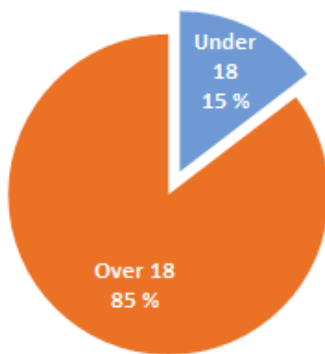

6. Nationality, sex and age breakdown of VARP departures: May 2002 - December 2011

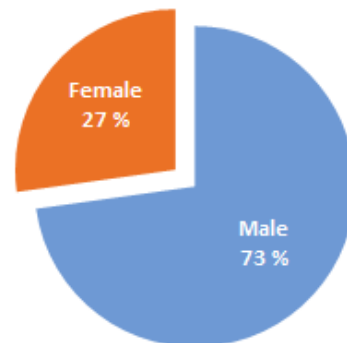

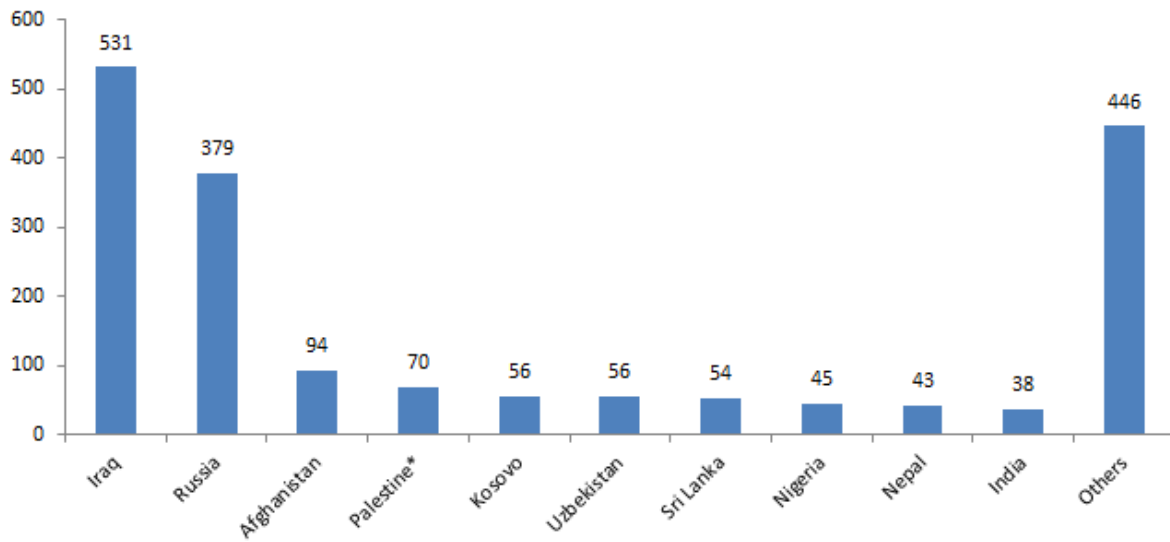

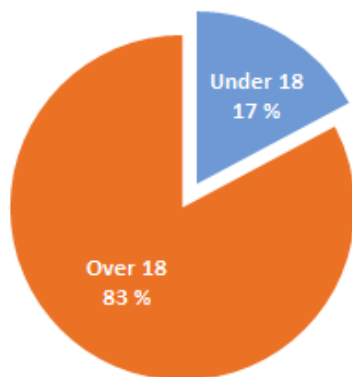

7. Nationality, sex and age breakdown of VARP departures: January 2011 - December 2011

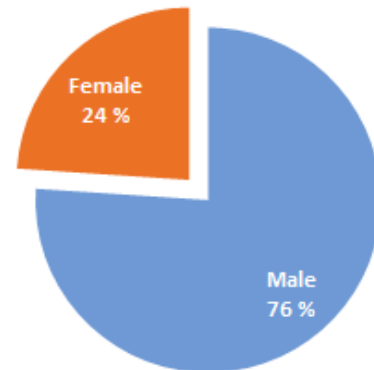

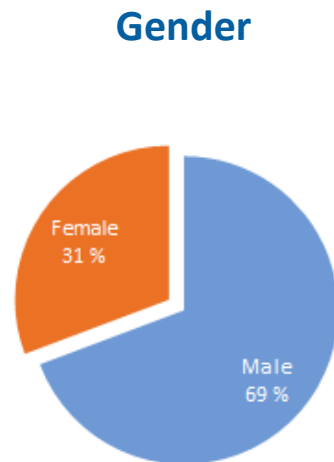
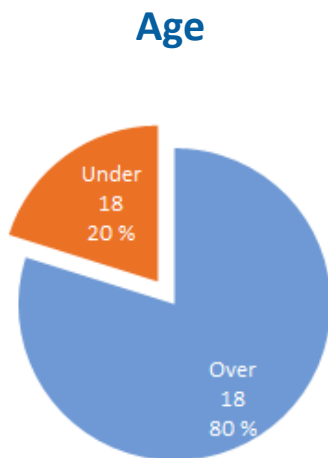
8. VARP applications and departures from UDI regions, quarterly comparison: January 2011 - December 2011



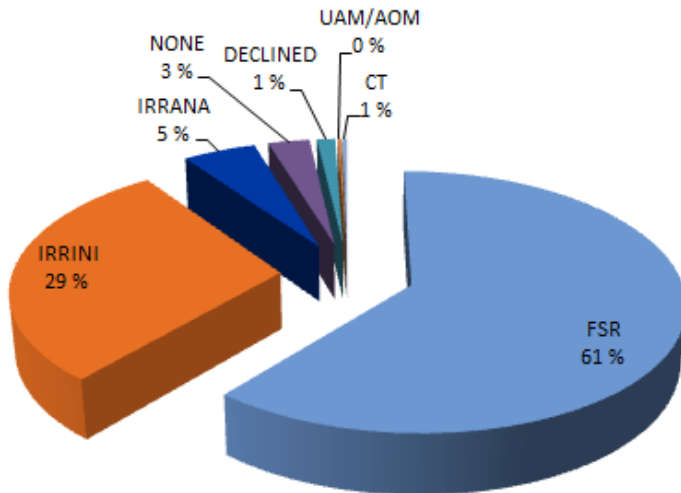
9. Nationality, sex and age breakdown of total departures with FSR support: January 2011 - December 2011.

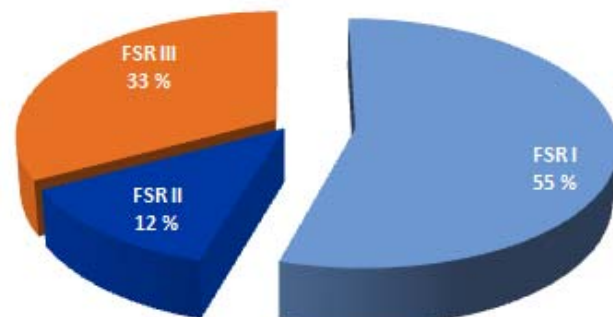
10. Programme breakdown of departures with and without reintegration support: January 2011 - December 2011

- **IRRINI:** Information, return and reintegration assistance for Iraqi nationals to Iraq.
- **IRRANA:** Information, return and reintegration assistance for Afghan nationals to Afghanistan.
- **UAM/AOM:** Return and reintegration assistance for unaccompanied minor and aged-out minor asylum seekers in Norway.
- **CT:** Return and reintegration assistance service to victims of trafficking in Norway.
- **Declined:** declined reintegration support after approval.
- **None:** reintegration support rejected after application.

FSR I, II & III Breakdown January 2011 - December 2011 **

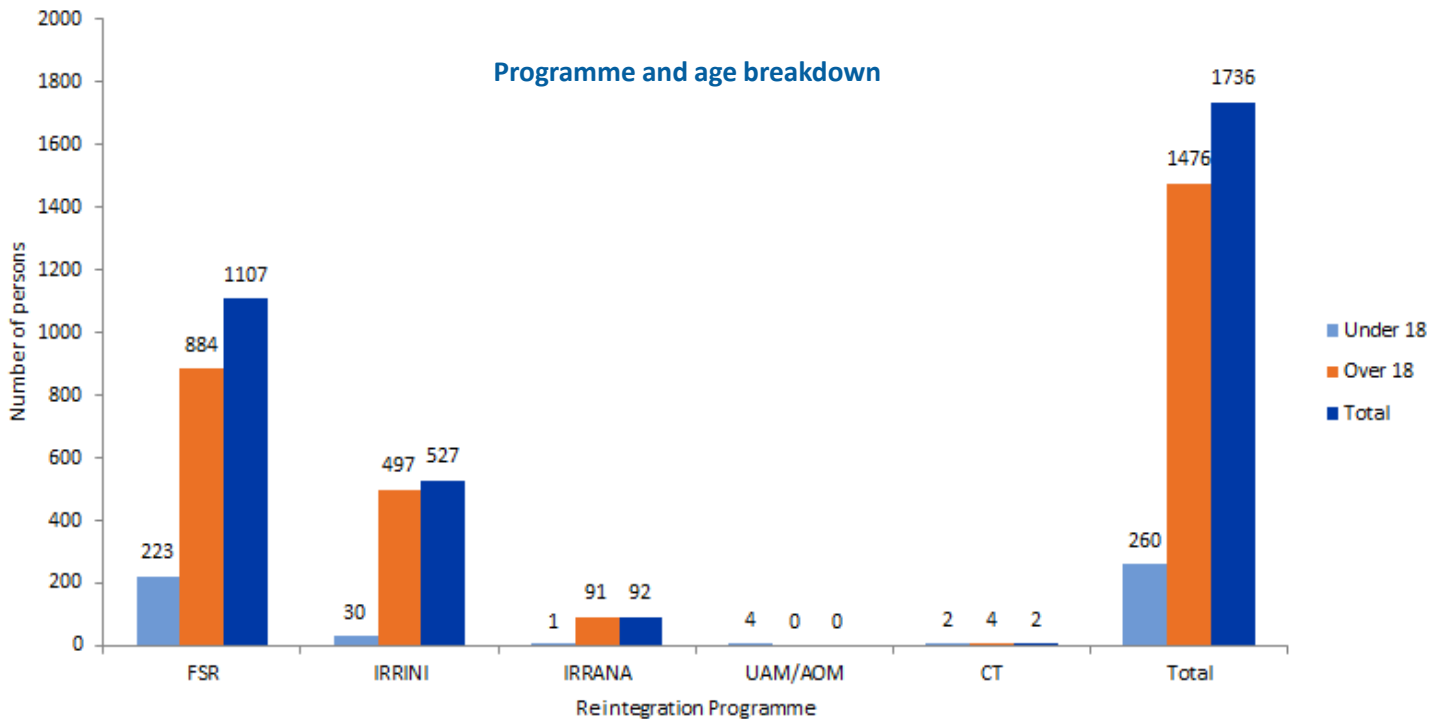
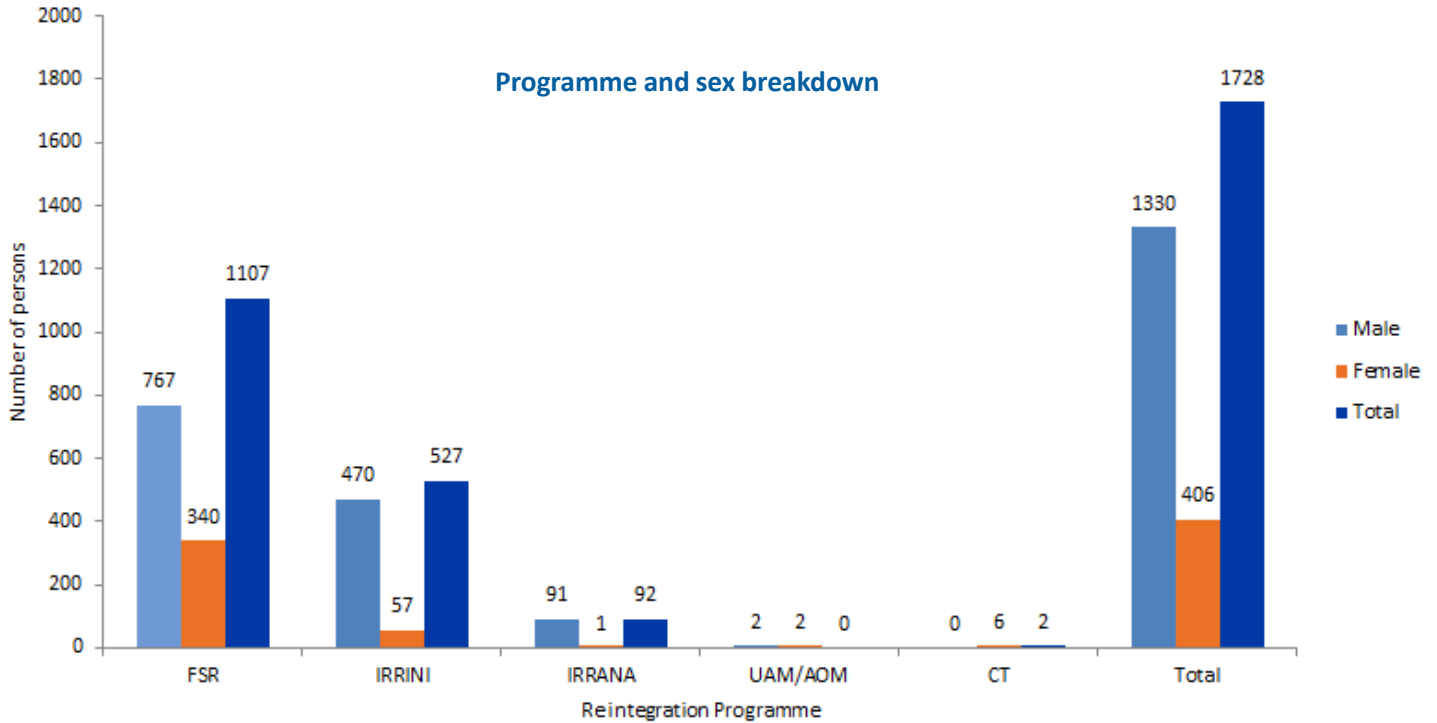
